

## **WALMART DONATION PROGRAM**

The Walmart donation program will include more than 2,500 Super Centers and 160 Neighborhood Markets. Feeding America estimates that the store donation program for Walmart stores will yield more than 80 million pounds for our network each year, not including the existing Sam's Club program. This influx of food will help us to address increasing food demands throughout the country, which have risen more than 50 percent over the past year in some areas.

### ***Projections Based on Pilot Program***

Based on the results of our Super Center pilot program, each store will average more than 900 pounds donated per week.

We approximate category breakout to be:

- Bakery: 40 percent
- Dry Grocery (Canned Goods): 27 percent
- Meat: 16 percent
- Produce: 14 percent
- Dairy: 3 percent

### ***Basic Program***

- All perishable categories will be included (meat, deli, dairy, produce and bakery). Dry grocery products that are not returned through reclamation will also be donated.
- Feeding America members may authorize agencies to pick on their behalf. Wal-Mart will only allow one organization per store. The agency must report donation pounds back to the Feeding America member, and the member will need to Blue Receipt the donations.
- **Industry-approved Passive Temperature-Controlled Devices** (ie- freezer blankets) will be allowed for pickups where the transportation of product to the storage/distribution location is less than 30 minutes in duration.
- Wal-Mart will require a minimum of three pickups per week. Schedules can be established at the local level with stores.
