


Estimated increases in unemployment by county - 2020

Percentage point increase in unemployment in SHH's service area (2020)




Estimated increases in unemployment by county – May-Dec

Percentage point increase in unemployment in SHH's service area (May-Dec)




Estimated increases in unemployment by county – Q2 2020

Percentage point increase in unemployment in SHH's service area (Q2 2020)




Estimated increases in unemployment by county – Q3 2020

Percentage point increase in unemployment in SHH's service area (Q4 2020)


